• _ College of Education and Social Work: Elizabeth Levya-Guidici

- Met with various education and social work students
 - Discussed what changes they would like to see within our college. Social worker majors have expressed many issues with scheduling, and having a lower student to teacher ratio for the spring semester required classes. Education majors have expressed the inconvenient student teaching times, and would like to see different times available.

■ _ First Generation: Kayden McCabe

- Met with West Chester First Committee, at the beginning of the month.
 - Discussed goals to engage faculty and staff with our students. November is National First Gen Month!
 - We also are planning to meet with First Gen President Salea at an upcoming time to partner with First Gen Rams.

_Wells School of Music: Miles Cressely

 - Discussed the district 12 PMEA conference on Thursday and the winter holiday festival.

Dining Services: Derrick Addison

- Met with Nick Ventrola, Resident District Manager for Aramark.
 - Discussed the We Load Campaign if you Load 100 flex there is a grubhub incentive. Swipe out for hunger to donate meal swipes for students in need. Byte coolers are located in buildings like the BPMC. They are new coolers with name brand snacks and to-go sandwiches. Other initiatives include Sykes Lineup changes and that the sykes lids and straws moved.
- _ West Chester Community: Anamarie Toussaint
 - Discussed coordinating an event with Mayor Debaptiste to come speak to students. Issues that will be brought up include: how to be a rising leader, time management, balancing responsibilities since the Mayor is a mayor part time and a funeral director full time, OCRC Mental health services pertaining specifically to suicide, and Civic engagemen.

■ _ Off Campus and Commuter Services: Marcella Tate

- Met with Dr. Lexie McCarthy, Director of Off Campus and Commuter Services, on October 29th.
 - Discussed that 350 people attended the Off Campus Housing Fair. On Sunday they had their mandatory adopt-a-spot, 22 groups participated and roughly 120 people in each group. The office is now offering more time for legal aid because more people have been using it. The office is beginning to work on an emergency fund, which they will get the money from their partnership on apartments.com.
 - 400 people are actively participating in the commuter incentive program. The Off Campus Commuter Assistants have been meeting with their partners and

they have completed 10 tabling events in the dorms to help students who are looking to move off campus.

■ _ University Libraries: Annie Wineka

- Met with Dierdre Childs, Director of Public Services, and Amy Pajewski, Student Success Librarian on October 23rd.
 - Discussed reviving the Student Library Advisory Board. Discussed the main goals of the board and the plan to utilize the board. Created a plan for ways to spread the word around campus, and we also reached out to prior members of the board to gauge interest in re-participation. Created plans to hand out some goodies/snacks for finals week to help boost morale and bring awareness about the student library advisory board.
 - Discussed the revival of the Friends of the Library program and how to get the word out to the community. As a follow-up, I got in touch with West Chester Community Senator Anamarie to discuss the best options to spread the word into the community.

_ Panhellenic Council: Ann Strobeck

- Met with the Panhellenic Executive Board, Stephen Hopson and Alyssa Innauruto, FSL advisors on 10/24.
 - Discussed plans for a PHC brunch for members who make it onto the Dean's List this semester and we are working on some form of PHC scholarship (still in works on details. The office prepped with IFC for homecoming this past weekend by dropping off care packages at each fraternity house. Discussed promoting formal recruitment for the spring as applications for Potential New Members opened last week. They had just over 50 signed up as of 10/24 when the form had been open for 7 days. Some promotions include posting on PHC Instagram as well as individual chapters, yard signs around campus and hosting events to create interest. Discussed the planning of the Community-Wide PHC/IFC Town Clean-up on Nov 10 which is now open to anyone interested! Discussed the planning of Dancing with the Greeks on 11/16. It is a competition similar to Dancing with the Stars event to raise money for PHC's philanthropy Circle of Sisterhood. Discussed planning an event with the recruitment counselors to help answer questions for PNMS in a casual way prior to recruitment to promote signups.

■ _Sustainability: Alix Brewer

- Met with Brad Flamm, Director of Office of Sustainability, and Calli Lambard, Administrative Assistant of Office of Sustainability on October 18th.
 - Discussed the Green Fund proposal denial, and we talked about other general updates, as well as some ideas for what to do moving forward still in the works.
 - On Wednesday, October 23, I stopped by the Sustainability showcase on the Quad and connected with the different people tabling. One of the most notable topics I talked about was with Dr. Matthew McMahon, an Economics professor here who does work with sustainability and facilities; the new

library is supposed to get a new roof within the next year or two, and there has been approval for solar panels to be put in with the new roof, pending funding for these panels.
