## Senator Reports

• \_ On Campus Housing: Nathan Shallack

- o Met with Denine Rocco, Dean of Students.
  - Discussed the modular housing for next year..
- Legislative Affairs: Lukas Williamson and West Chester Community: Anamarie Toussaint
  - Met with The Mayor of West Chester, on 11/12.
    - Discussed one of the biggest complaints that residents have for students isn't noise, but rather destruction of property, late night drinking, and very visible public intoxication.
    - Discussed, if you are in an approved student rental, you can get the parking pass with an out of state registration. If not, then your license and registration needs to match with the property at which you reside.
    - Discussed that as a woman leader, she feels connected to women and would want to give advice on how to be a women leader if she came to campus.
- \_ Student Leadership and Involvement: Noah Smith
  - Met with Care Jenkins, Director of Student Leadership and Involvement.
    - Discussed operations within SLI. Recently, SLI has wrapped up some key initiatives like the Voting Plan Initiative.
      - On November 5th, we finalized the results and the Athletic Training Club took the first prize of \$250 in SSI Funding, Phi Kappa Epsilon Honors Fraternity took 2nd prize of \$150, and the WCU Gaming club took 3rd prize with \$100. Over 150 individuals across 30 organizations participated in the initiative.
      - Second, the New and Forming Orgs workgroup of SLI has created and begun distributing New Org Kits to newly formed organizations.
        These kits include note pads, clipboards, tablecloths, plexi-sign holders, and a resource binder with tips for new exec boards, FPPs and SOPPs, as well as other helpful documentation. Each organization passed by this senate has received a kit.
      - Lastly, a memo was sent to all organization presidents about operational changes to all organization bylaws, as well as the implementation of a new bylaw template. These changes include updated requirements for the disclosure of officer conduct and GPA records, updated membership expectation requirements, and a member accountability process. There's also updated language for the Anti-discrimination statement. These changes are required for successful re-registration come April; any organizations without these changes to their bylaws will receive a denial for re-registration and must re-attempt. #### ■ Jasmine Stewart: CAP-C

- o Met with Dr. Rodeny Mader.
  - Discussed what CAP-C is, how to connect with students if any policy issues arise, and policies they are working on fixing. Some of these policies include the repeat course policy as they navigate on whether to decrease or increase

the repeat limit, and whether to make the Academic Forgiveness policy more flexible and catering specifically to students who changed their majors.

## ■ College of Arts and Humanities: Maggie Olsen-Rye

- Met with Cyndy Pilla, Deans Team Staff as planning & logistics, on Thursday, November 7th.
  - Discussed the Poetry Center and the nearing deadline of submissions toward the 2025 Donald Justice Poetry Prize, and the upcoming Iris Spencer Poetry Awards. The Iris Spencer is a great opportunity for undergraduate students nationally, regardless of your areas of study, and a good way to put yourself out there if you're interested in poetry. Discussed the issues of AC temperature regulation in Main Hall and the process of getting it fixed

## ■ \_ Diversity and Multicultural Affairs: Jen Harter

- Met with Campus Climate Intervention Team on November 6th.
  - Discussed an equitable way to inform students on when specific groups are on campus. The campus does not want to seem like they are favoring any group or community, but we want to be able to inform students in a timely manner when these groups show up to campus so students are aware.

#### ■ College of Business and Public Management: Anthony Forgacic

- o Met with Dr. Leach, POSITION, on DATE.
  - Discussed the survey that I am creating for general feedback to see where we can make improvements. We got a basis for the questions. Some example questions look into how people feel about BPMC events and how the technology and facilities within the building impact students.

#### ■ Panhellenic Council: Ann Strobeck

- Met with Panhellenic Executive Board and FSL advisors on 11/7.
  - Discussed the New executive board has been slated for 2025 year. They are waiting for delegates from each chapter to confirm the slate this week. FSL, had a successful town clean up with the mayor on Sunday. The organization is still planning Dean's brunch. RCs and the new and old PHC executive board had DEI training this afternoon with a guest speaker. 100 PNMs are registered for spring recruitment! Anyone who signs up for formal recruitment will be entered in a giveaway to win a LuluLemon bag.

#### ■ Senator: Name

- o Met with Lieutenant McGill on 11/7.
  - Discussed concerns that took place leading to the Election. People who were promoting Project 2025 ideologies were walking around campus and attempting to have people sign voter pledges to support their stance. In response, students were feeling uncomfortable with these individuals because they would go walking door to door in residence halls and since they appeared as ordinary students, they were able to enter the building. Lieutenant McGill advised that if a future situation similar to this were to occur, students can call public safety and they can kick them out of the campus or arrest them for trespassing if people continue. Officers are more

than happy to help affected students in the long run and can be used as a resource should this happen again..

## ■ \_ Honors College: Olivia McClain

- Met with Dr. Jussaume, Director of the Honors College, on 11/12/24.
  - Discussed issues that were brought up at his first luncheon with honors students. One topic that was talked about at his luncheon was about Honors housing. The department is trying to determine whether students would want to remain in Allegheny for their first year or transition to traditional housing.

## ■ \_ Athletics Senator: Lucas Henke

- Met with Kelli Milliner, Associate Ad, and the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee Executive Board.
  - Discussed the planning of the Make-A-Wish event. The recipient confirmed that Finnegan is 3 years old and battling cancer, and his wish is to go to Disney and Universal, and will be making that happen. The wish celebration ceremony will be on February 19th at the Men's Basketball game at halftime. Also, the Advisory Committee just finished our second big community-building event on November 11th, the annual athletics dodgeball tournament. Largest turn-out ever with 23 of 24 athletics teams represented on the mixed teams participating.

## ■ College of Science and Mathematics: Rainna Liddington

- Met with Dean of College of Science and Mathematics.
  - Discussed ways SGA can help the department, for example promoting events and voicing student concerns. There is a new position in the dean's office that will specifically be a student-focused seat, more information pending.
